



Proposed Bylaw Amendments

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 305 -- EXPULSION OF MEMBERS

A. The Board may vote to expel Members for the following causes: (i) conviction of a criminal offense involving moral turpitude; (ii) failure to carry out contracts, agreements or obligations with the Credit Union; (iii) refusal to comply with reasonable requests of Credit Union staff or security personnel related to health, safety, or security while in Credit Union branches or facilities; (iv) engaging in abusive, threatening, or harassing behavior toward Credit Union staff, volunteers, or Members, or the abuse of Credit Union systems or property; or (iiiiv) refusal to comply with California Credit Union law, any other law or ordinance governing the Credit Union and its operations, or these Bylaws.

B. If the Board votes s to expel, the Board will notify the Member of the expulsion and that the expelled Member may, by submitting a written request to the Board within 15 days of the mailing date of the Board's notice, appeal the Board's decision to the Members of the Credit Union.



Proposed Bylaw Amendments

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

SECTION 1007 – ELECTRONIC MEETINGS

Any meeting described in in these Bylaws may be convened through an electronic platform rather than a specific location to the fullest extent authorized by law. If so convened:

A. The term “place” shall be deemed to include the electronic platform announced for such meeting;

B. The terms “in person” and “present” shall be deemed established for all quorum, voting, and other purposes for any person who personally participates in the meeting through the electronic platform.

SECTION 1008 – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, any business of this Credit Union may be conducted through electronic means to the fullest extent authorized by law. Such business includes but is not limited to any Board, Committee, Member, or other meetings, voting, petitions, notices, and any other matter without limitation.
